Students will identify the risks of using public Wi-Fi networks and learn how to protect their personal information.

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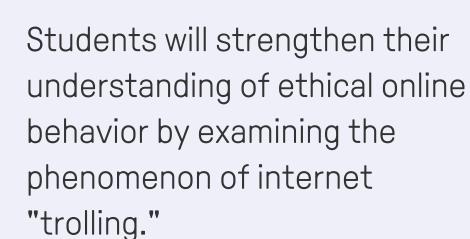
HIGH SCHOOL (GRADES 9-12)
