## ISTE DIGITAL CITIZEN STANDARDS

### 1.2.a

Students cultivate and manage their digital identity and reputation and are aware of the permanence of their actions in the digital world.

### 1.2.b

Students engage in positive, safe, legal and ethical behavior when using technology, including social interactions online or when using networked devices.

### 1.2.c

Students demonstrate an understanding of and respect for the rights and obligations of using and sharing intellectual property.

### 1.2.d

Students manage their personal data to maintain digital privacy and security and are aware of data-collection technology used to track their navigation online.

## ELEMENTARY (GRADES 3-5)

### Digital Footprint



Students will identify online actions that create a digital footprint and learn how to responsibly manage their online identity.

### Cyberbullying



Students will recognize cyberbullying by comparing and contrasting what bullying looks like in the real world and in digital spaces.

### Online Images



Students will analyze examples of manipulated digital images and learn how to engage critically with online imagery.

### Strong Passwords



Students will practice creating strong passwords in order to protect their personal accounts and data.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL (GRADES 6-8)

### Digital Actions



Students will take responsibility for their online actions by identifying key differences between digital and physical communication.

### Making Friends Online



Students will recognize the benefits and risks of making friends online so they can more safely interact in digital spaces.

### Plagiarism



Students will analyze the forms plagiarism can take, identify common causes of plagiarism, and enact best practices to prevent plagiarism in their own work.

### Public Wi-Fi



Students will identify the risks of using public Wi-Fi networks and learn how to protect their personal information.

## HIGH SCHOOL (GRADES 9-12)

### Passive Digital Footprint Alert



Students will recognize how digital footprints are created through passive and active behaviors and identify steps to take control of their digital footprints.

### Trolling



Students will strengthen their understanding of ethical online behavior by examining the phenomenon of internet "trolling."

### Disinformation & Misinformation



Students will engage critically with online information by categorizing examples of disinformation and misinformation and identifying the motivations behind them.

### Scams



Students will identify common forms of online scams in order to maintain their digital security.
